School Description
Gerald A. Smith Elementary School is located in the northern region of Bloomington and serves students in grades transitional kindergarten through six following a traditional calendar. At the beginning of the 2021-22 school year, 592 students were enrolled, including 10.8% in special education, 30.1% qualifying for English Language Learner support, and 69.3% qualifying for free or reduced price lunch.

# School Facilities & Maintenance

The district takes great efforts to ensure that all schools are clean, safe, and functional through proper facilities maintenance and campus supervision. Gerald A. Smith Elementary School's original facilities were built in 1966; ongoing maintenance and campus improvements ensure facilities remain up to date and provide adequate space for students and staff. District maintenance and site custodial staff ensure that the repairs necessary to keep the school in good condition are completed in a timely manner. A work order process is used by school and district staff to communicate non-routine maintenance requests. Emergency repairs are given the highest priority. In the last 12 months, repair projects on portable #32 were completed.

Every morning before school begins, the custodian inspects facilities for safety hazards or other conditions that need attention prior to students and staff entering school grounds. One day custodian and an evening crew are assigned to Gerald A. Smith Elementary School. The day custodian is responsible for:

- Cafeteria setup/cleanup
- Restroom cleaning
- Basic maintenance
- Event setup/cleanup

Restrooms are checked throughout the day for cleanliness and subsequently cleaned as needed. The evening crew is responsible for:

- Classroom cleaning
- Office area cleaning
- Restroom cleaning

The principal communicates with custodial staff daily concerning maintenance and school safety issues.
